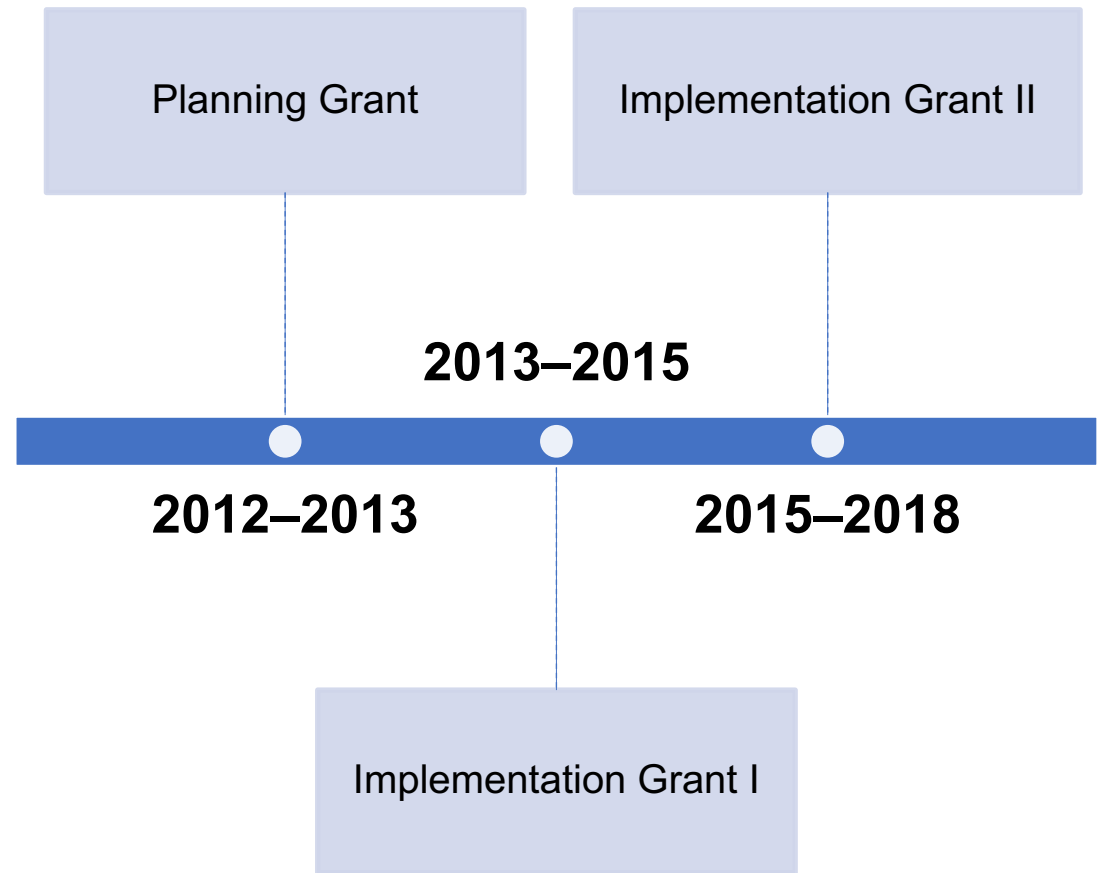

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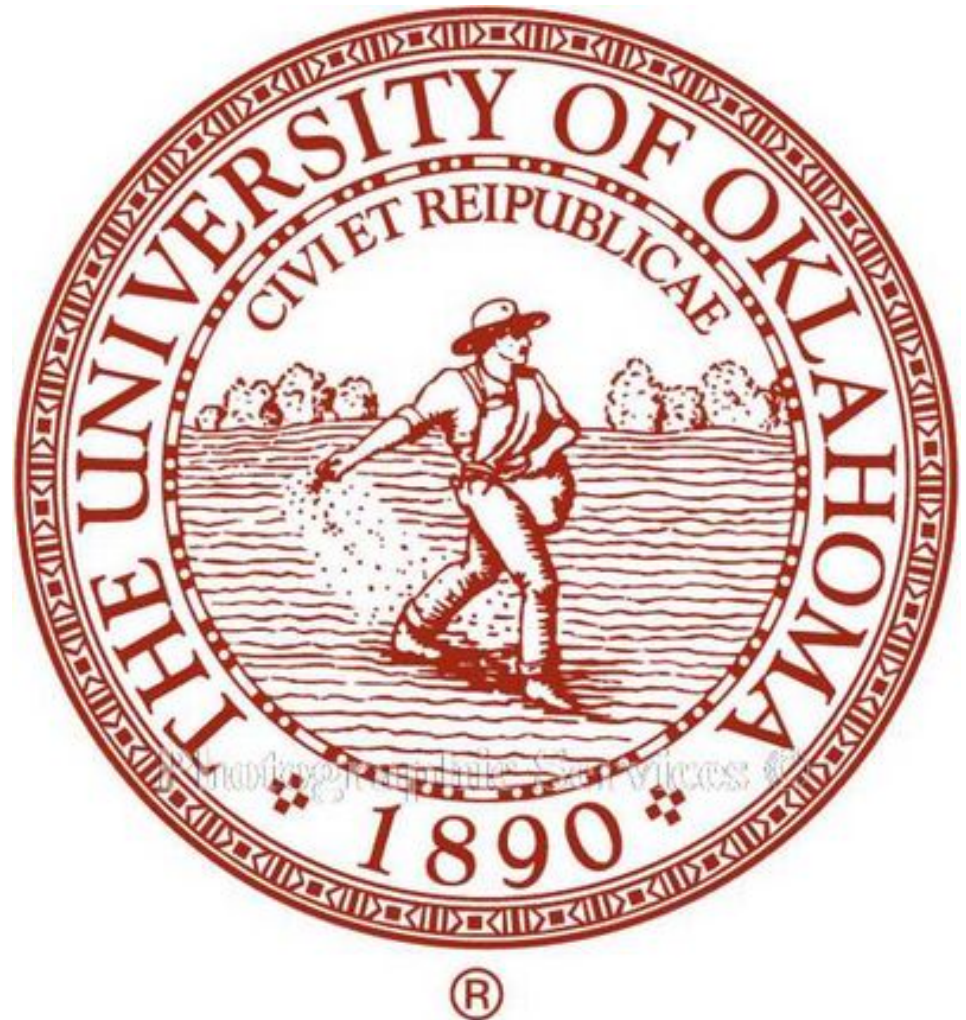

Goals for the DLL Catalog

- To create authority records for authors and editors of Latin texts
- To create work authorities for all Latin texts
- To catalog all editions of Latin texts
- To publish Linked Open Data

DLL Catalog: Status

- 3229 authority records for authors and editors
- 5261 work authorities
- 2470 items in the catalog

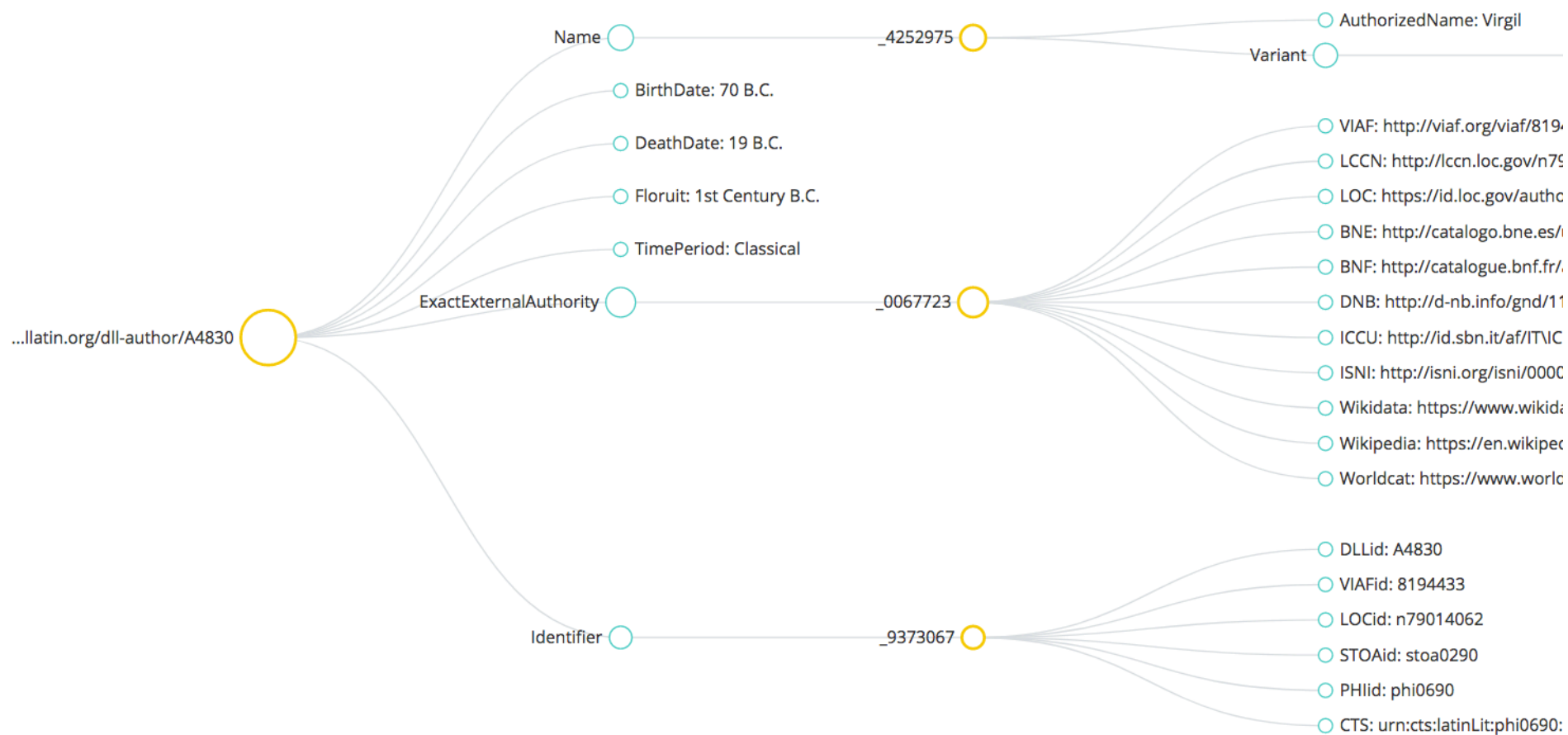

LDLT Goals

- Data model
- Applications for working with LDLT data
- Policies and procedures for operations and publication

What is an LDLT Edition?

- A critical edition of a Latin text or texts
- Peer-reviewed scholarship
- Published by a learned society
- Textual data encoded in XML according to specific guidelines
- Stored in a version-controlled repository with auxiliary materials (images, collation tables, notes, correspondence, etc.)
- Published under an open license

What an LDLT
Edition is NOT:

- A custom-designed interface that highlights the unique characteristics of a specific text
- A web page
- A codex
- A commercial product

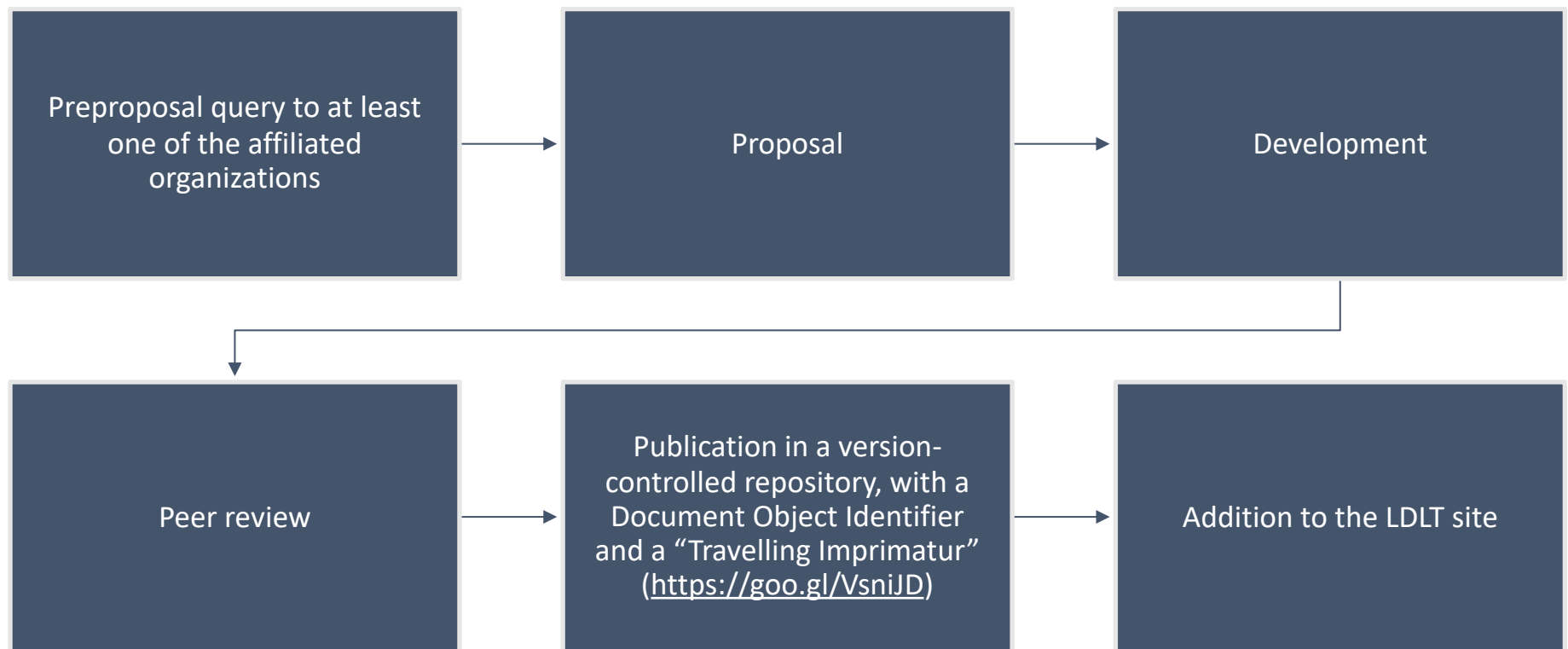

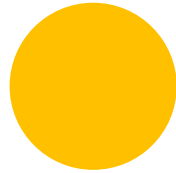
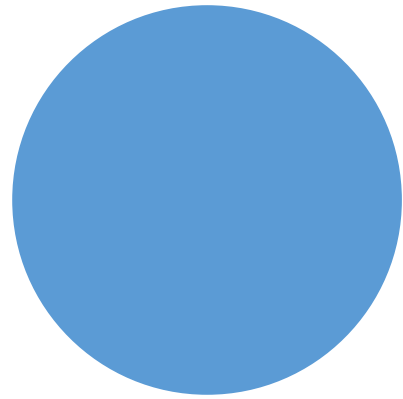
